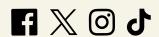

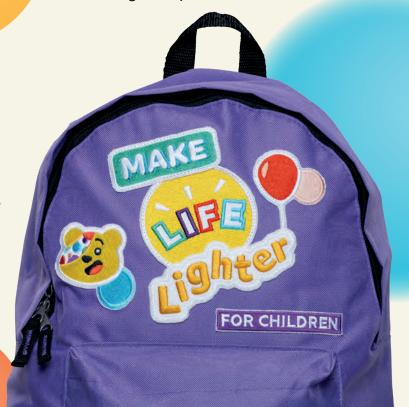

This autumn, you can get together with family and friends and ramble around your favourite spot to raise money. Get ramble-ready by visiting our website to download resources.



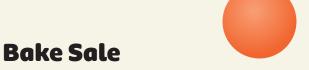
7 Sponsored Events

BBC CHILDREN IN NEED BELIEVES THAT EVERY CHILD SHOULD HAVE THE CHANCE TO THRIVE AND BE

THE BEST THEY CAN BE

For this to happen, we want every child to have someone they can turn to for help or support to overcome challenges they face.

We make sure there's someone able to give food, clothes and beds to a child living without; someone qualified to talk a child who is anxious, isolated or grieving; someone to be there for children living with serious illness, disability or carrying a load that's just too heavy to manage alone.

This year, BBC Children in Need is asking you to help make life lighter for children. Only with your support can we be there for hundreds of thousands of children when they need us most.



BBC Children in Need is a charity that supports other charities, funding people and projects across the UK, in the communities where you live. Over the past year, BBC Children in Need has supported 1,434 projects* across the UK, and the Emergency Essentials programme is just one example of how we are helping to make life lighter for thousands of children.

The BBC Children in Need Emergency Essentials Programme supports children and young people who are facing exceptionally difficult circumstances. The programme provides items that meet a child's most basic needs such as a bed to sleep in, a cooker to provide a hot meal and other items or services critical to a child's wellbeing. The £3 million per year programme is delivered in partnership with Family Fund Business Services, the UK's largest grant-making charity for families raising a disabled or seriously ill child, on a low income.

In 2023, Family Fund delivered 25,000 items to families, in crisis, across the whole of the UK. This included:

5325 beds to sleep on

2393 cookers 1850 washing machines

667 baby items

Jessica**, a mum with a young daughter with additional needs and a baby son, was living in rented accommodation. Jessica could only afford to buy an old second-hand washing machine which soon broke and started leaking water all over the kitchen floor. Jessica found it hard to cope, especially as her children needed clean clothes every day and the cost of a new washing machine was too high for her household budget. Her support worker applied for a new washing machine through BBC Children in Need's Emergency Essential programme which was delivered within the week.

Jessica says, "It was stressful because I like everything to be clean and tidy and the washing was just piling up. It was affecting me mentally and making me anxious. The new washing machine has made a big difference."

Now Jessica's daughter can go to school in a clean uniform and the baby always has freshly washed bedding in his cot.

Glow NI Belfast

Belfast

GLOW (Giving Life Opportunities to Women) deliver personal development, wellbeing programmes and a summer scheme to girls aged 10-17 in Belfast, who have been impacted by mental health, self-esteem and confidence issues throughout their young lives. Through these programmes the girls feel heard, valued and empowered and gain a true sense of purpose; with some of the girls even going on to complete youth leadership qualifications to help continue making an impact in their local community.

Moss Side Fire Station Boxing Club CIO

Manchester

This social action project gives young people the opportunity to use boxing facilities and take part in fitness training. It aims to engage with local young people in Moss Side and Hulme to raise their aspirations and give them positive futures.

Tumble Family Centre

Swansea

At Tumble Family Centre there is a dedicated play worker supporting young children and their families living in a rural area. The sessions and activities provided by the play worker all work to strengthen the self-belief of the children who attend.

Trelya

Penzance

This organisation provides one to one support and group work for children and young people experiencing multiple complex challenges. This grant will support children and young people to reach their potential, be safe and improve life outcomes.

Supports young people to find a safe space to connect with others and develop through youth work. With youth workers and peers they can develop and pursue their ambitions, understand and express their own and others' identities, and navigate challenges including mental health, area deprivation and bullying.

On-Your-Side Norwich Ltd

Norwich

provides one-to-one befriending support to young people from ethnic minorities to overcome the impact of marginalisation and improve mental wellbeing so that they can play an active and valuable part in their local communities. These activities greatly enhance the mental and physical wellbeing of a young person and offer support to them at a time of need.
